

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Galvatech's Emergency Plan sets out how Galvatech acts in the event of an emergency. It includes how to respond in the event of local, site and external emergencies.

The Plan is shared with regulators and emergency services and is updated whenever new information becomes available.

Emergency Services are the designated responders to emergencies, including those which have the potential **for** external impacts. For all emergencies other than those classified as local, Galvatech will notify Emergency Services by calling 000.

IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY

Residences

Galvatech's site is located in an industrial area with nearest residences located more than 450 m away. The nature of operations on the site is such that if an emergency were to occur the possibility of it impacting residences is low.

From your residence, if you see any abnormal occurrence such as smoke, odours, sound of explosions etc, which may originate from Galvatech's site, you should call 000 and report what you have seen or heard.

If you smell strong odours, or smoke is blowing in the direction of your residence, you should:

- Go inside and shut doors and windows
- Turn off air conditioners, exhaust fans etc.

until the occurrence has passed.

Emergency Services are responsible for community notification and are the only body who may initiate action such as evacuation outside Galvatech's site. If there is a risk to you, Emergency Services will direct you, and then advise when the emergency is terminated.

Neighbouring Properties

Galvatech maintains a register of the contact details of adjoining and close properties. If an emergency on Galvatech's site has the potential to impact on you, Galvatech will telephone or visit you. Once you have been advised, it is your decision to implement your own emergency procedures. Emergency Services are the only body who can lawfully order an evacuation.

If you become aware of an emergency incident on Galvatech's site prior to being advised, it is your decision to implement your own emergency procedures.

What kinds of emergencies could occur at Galvatech's site?

- Flammable gas fire /explosion
 - LP Gas, Natural Gas Fire
- Fire
 - Infrastructure, vehicles
 - Hydraulic Systems
- Acid/Alkali Spill
- Molten Metal Explosion/Spill
- Environmental emergency

In addition, the site could be affected by natural disasters and security threats.

Thorough risk assessment and risk reduction processes are in place to ensure NSW government safety and community impact requirements are achieved.

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How does Galvatech decide what is an "Emergency"?

Galvatech's trained workers assess the incident and consider a range of factors to decide whether or not an incident constitutes an "emergency".

The assessors consider:

- Are there people present in the area?
- Can there be affects on people or the environment?
- Are these affects onsite or offsite?
- Has anyone been injured?
- Can the event escalate?
- Are emergency services required to control the incident?

The priorities for emergency response are:

- Rescuing people in immediate danger
- Protecting people on and offsite
- Protecting the environment
- Notification of regulators

TYPES OF EMERGENCY

Local Emergency

- Contained to a limited area of site
- Does not impact the rest of site or offsite
- Response managed by plant personnel

Examples: medical emergency, local leak, small fire, equipment/structural failure, plant malfunction.

On Site Emergency

- Potential to affect all personnel on site
- May require assistance from Emergency Services
- Does not impact offsite

Examples: Chemical spill, contained fire

External Emergency

- Potential to affect personnel or assets off site
- Emergency Services are the designated responders

Examples: Chemical spill with potential to leave the site, major fire, smoke from a fire

If there is an external emergency::

- Galvatech immediately contacts 000
- Emergency services are the designated responders (e.g. Fire and Rescue NSW, NSW Ambulance, NSW Police)
- Galvatech assists emergency services by providing timely technical advice

Emergency services are responsible for community notification.

FOR EMERGENCIES THAT REQUIRE EVACUATION, EMERGENCY SERVICES ARE THE ONLY ONES WHO CAN LAWFULLY ORDER AN EVACUATION. FOLLOW THEIR INSTRUCTIONS.
